4. If you are not on my "Word of the Day" text messaging list - getting a Scripture verse and a short prayer each morning, simply text me and let me know and I'll get you signed up.





Who are you? No really, who are you? If you were asked that question, how would you respond? I know I'd start with my name, where I'm from, and my occupation, but is that really who I am? We've spent a good amount of time recently in our youth ministry talking about "identity". The word identity is defined: the fact of being who or what a person or thing is; The characteristics determining this. So, who are you?

There have been plenty of times in my life when I wasn't real proud of who I was or something I'd done. I remember as a kindergartener having to go home and tell my parents that I had stolen the equivalent of a Happy Meal toy from one of my classmate's backpacks. We get really good at hiding, camouflaging, and putting up a facade in order to fool people in to thinking we've got it all together. Guess what, none of us do!

We're all sinners. The bible is pretty clear on that subject. Since the beginning of creation, mankind has attempted to cover that fact up. In a moment, Adam and Eve went from having an unbroken fellowship with God to attempting to cover up their nakedness and shame as a result of sin. Thank goodness the story doesn't end at "for all have sinned...". That would be a pretty lousy identity. Instead, we are offered redemption through the blood of Christ. If you are a believer in Jesus, this verse describes you. "Therefore if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creature; the old things passed away; behold, new things have come." 2 Corinthians 5:17
