It's a great time to be a part of FBC Palestine!



I have my moments. Disciple Now Weekend just wrapped, and now comes the big exhale. It was a great weekend of study, worship, and fellowship. The theme for the weekend was "The Pause". In a crazy, fast paced, never slows down world, we need to be reminded to stop. Sometimes we need a break. Sometimes we just need to pause. Sometimes we just need a moment. I'm not sure there is a more pertinent and fitting theme for our teenagers in 2018. This got me thinking. You might say I had a "moment" of clarity.

Moment...that word has been on my mind the last couple of days. Life is made up of moments. Moments can be fun, scary, sad, boring, hopeless, hopeful, pleasant, agonizing, and on and on. By definition, moments don't last. They are fleeting. Blink and you'll miss it. However, many times moments are pivotal. I'm sure you can look back on your life at several instances that changed the very course of your life. Times that, had you chosen a different path, you'd find yourself in a very different place today. You may even be stuck in a moment that you can't get out of.

For me, becoming a follower of Christ, becoming a husband, and becoming a dad were the most pivotal moments of my life. I look back at the day Amy and I got married, and think "this magic moment." Reading in the book of Joshua this morning, I came upon the passage where Joshua addresses the people of Israel in chapter 24. He recounts God's faithfulness to the Jews. It was and is an incredible reminder of how God is in control. It speaks to His great love for His people. In verses 14 and 15 comes the moment of truth.

"...fear the Lord and serve Him ... " "... choose for yourselves this day whom you will serve ... " I imagine Joshua's sentiments being something like this is. "God is faithful. He has been faithful, and He continues to be faithful. It's time to make a choice. When you walk away from here, you will have made your decision! What are you gonna do?" It was, without a doubt, a pivotal moment for the Jews. If you are a Christian, then you have had a moment similar to that of the one written about in Joshua. The Holy Spirit draws, and we must respond. If you've not trusted Christ, I pray that you respond as the Spirit calls on your heart.

I hope that this article is a reminder to you to stop, and reflect on the faithfulness of God. Choose today to serve Him. Maybe this is one of your moments. Don't miss it. Whether they know it or not, the world is desperate for the news of Jesus. It's our responsibility to share the message of Christ. Start today...not a moment too soon.
